- To turn Canada around spiritually, we need to deploy capable pastors and effective churches



CHANGE AHEAD

The landscape of life in ministry is always changing whether it is on a macro sphere or a personal level. After a difficult season of life and ministry 26 years ago, I sat down and documented the major changes that I had faced over the previous 4-year period. After completing this list of change-points, I was surprised by all that was different. Over the years, I'd been to enough "stress" workshops and spoken to enough counselors to know, from a purely human perspective, change brings stress and too much change can be destructive. It was clear in my mind that society's diagnosis would say that I should have been surviving and functioning through the assistance of medication. The fact of the matter was – I was doing just fine!! Sure, I had some low points, and some questioning moments but I was okay!

In John 15, Jesus speaks to the Resource we need as His followers - "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much

fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." Paul says the same thing in Romans 8 - "When that same Spirit that raised Christ from the dead dwells in you, it will quicken (or give life to) your mortal body." For me in that season, the life of God living in me was giving me strength beyond anything natural, to face and deal with all the changes I had been facing. Part of that life-giving power came through the support of individuals which included people from my District. They became a lifeline for me in various ways. They cared for me and supported me as I was encountering "life".

Why is this part of my life story so important for you as a leader in His Kingdom today? It is because the Church is facing tremendous change today, possibly greater than at any other time of history. Serving in God's Kingdom has been and is challenging. Many years ago, I received a book from our District at our annual Minister's Gathering. It was entitled, "An Unstoppable Force...daring to become the Church God has in mind," by Erwin McManus, and he said in the opening section: "Every living system that is fruitful and multiplies is required to adapt to the environment in which

it has been placed. Species that thrive are species that adapt. Species that do not adapt to change do not survive because change is an ever-present reality.”

As Church and Ministry leaders, we need to be on guard of the rigid, armour-like garments that will try to stifle the change that the Holy Spirit wants to work in us. He wants us to put on a garment of “spandex” that will allow us to grow and change as God is desiring us to. Becoming flexible also means realizing that I do not have all that may be required on my own, and I need to be willing to seek out resources that are offered to help me stand fast and move forward.

As you face changes in life and ministry, the Alberta NWT District has the desire “to walk” with you. That may look a bit differently for each of one of you depending on circumstances. Your needs in a season might vary from someone else’s. You may need a listening ear and voice of encouragement, you may require resources and counsel, or you may find another aspect of support that is needed. That is where someone from your District can come along beside you. Remember the wisdom of Ecclesiastes 4, “Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up.”

As this Conference completes my final term and almost eleven years of serving the Alberta NWT District, I want to express my gratitude for this opportunity to serve in this capacity. I know for all of us, change is ahead! The truth that keeps me calm in the change is a passage in Psalms that I often quote: “Blessed are those whose strength is in you, whose hearts are set on pilgrimage....They go from strength to strength, till each appears before God.” (84:5,7)

In 2017, churches, organizations and individuals continued to provide your ABNWT District with resources. Thank you for sharing the resources of people and time in serving District churches and ministries in a variety of capacities. You have also provided dollar resources – almost \$2.2 million that have come from across our constituency. But it is not only the dollar itself, it is also in stewarding every one of those dollars to create an occasion, an appointment, an opportunity for ministry. You have given us the privilege (and responsibility) of “making the most of every opportunity”.

Some of those opportunities have been to:

- Fund eleven church plants with the financial support of \$185,000 in 2017
- Offer hundreds of pastoral care visits and leader-mentoring appointments
- Assist in the navigation of multiple church pastoral transitions and pastor/board matters
- Give hundreds of hours of advice, counsel and direction in areas of church planting and multiplication efforts, governance oversight and development, financial matters, leadership care, and leadership development via phone, Skype, FaceTime or in person

Whether you're a solo pastor or in a multi-staff setting, your District provides consultation opportunities in the areas such as policy development, bookkeeping, and facility management. You also have opportunity to engage with Next Gen specialists in youth and children's ministry. Your District is front and centre working with churches to implement a vitalization strategy through the engagement of effectiveness coaches who assist in analysis, work with your board, train lay leaders, and ultimately move your church towards greater fruitfulness.

Your District interests are also represented at the boardroom tables of multiple ministries and endeavors, including Vanguard College, PAOC National Committees, and World Missions.

Thank you for helping us make this happen, which required District leadership to travel over 130,000 kilometers across Alberta and the Northwest Territories in 2017.

In short – we are using the financial resources from churches to build and develop capable leaders and effective churches. Thank you for helping us make the most of every opportunity!





MORE TO COME...

Thanks for letting me take a moment to share with you some of the great new ideas and projects going on at your college!

HOUSING - We are in talks and exploring what student housing could look like at Vanguard. It needs to fit with our purpose and programs, it needs to leverage our assets, and it needs to make sense. More to come!

PROGRAM - We have a new degree in Pastoral Care and Counseling! This is super-exciting and is built upon a solid biblical studies framework. Grads will be equipped to really help people deal with all kinds of dysfunctional life issues and bring the power of the gospel to them. It is offered as a full degree, a post-degree, a one-year certificate, and a skill certificate of about 5 courses.

FUTURE LEADER TRAINING - We are in conversation with NAIT about bi-vocational tracks! This makes sense for people like Global Workers, Church Planters, small church pastors in rural settings, and people who want a ministry-filled life, but still want to work in a secular setting!

DISCIPLESHIP TRAINING - Not sure what this is going to look like either, but we have a burden to train up both pastors and servant volunteers. Maybe less academics, a mission trip, local church mentorships, and personal growth in their walk with Christ - the possibilities are immense.




2. When prompted, complete authentication by entering your username and password. If you're an eligible voter, your unique username & password should be found on your conference name badge.
